Two potential amendments that Bylaws is considering are:

- 1. Reducing the notice time for an emergency meeting from 48 hours to 24. There have been several times over the past year where making the 48 hour window was difficult. Given that everyone can easily get notice via email and if necessary, attend an emergency zoom meeting, 24 hours seems sufficient.
- 2. Judy has raised whether we need an emergency provision for things like natural disasters where the President can take action with only a majority vote of officers. We can discuss before, during, or after today's meeting. I think there is a decent chance that the 24 hour notice amendment may be sufficient to address any emergencies the SNC could foreseeably need to address, but I admit there may be scenarios I am not contemplating.

The communications committee has developed a plan to add a "Lost Pets" section to the website. We are going to try to add QR codes for different parts of the website to make it easier for newsletter readers to

check links. Also, some dates and entries on the website need to be updated and we will be working with Kelly and Julie to get these changes made.
