 - Code enforcement ensures that properties remain maintained, also enforce city rental ordinance, handle mosquito control
 - o 678 registered rental units
 - 172 new code cases in 2022, majority overgrowth, debris
 - Resolved 150 cases in 2022
 - Photographs are helpful for making a report, probable cause, code enforcement then will assess violation
 - They assess points for parties in the neighborhood, 15 points before rental licenses are revoked, charging \$100 per point
 - You can call Solid Waste for special pick-ups (mattresses, move-outs), 545-3800

Committee Reports:

Beautification: Andrew Clarkson, chair

- April 23 and 24th is Columbia Green festival of garden tours
- Columbia Green has offered SNC an extension to their grant which was awarded 2021 for additional
 plants, at the Triangle Park on the corner of Harden and Heyward. Plans are under way for
 implementation of this grant. Updated quotes for several plant and materials venders are being
 sought. Additionally, SNC approved mulch, and on-going maintenance
 - This grant stipulate that we furnish and install all materials listed in the grant and they will reimburse up the approved amount of \$775. With the inevitable price increases, SNC may need to supplement the Columbia Green funding for this portion as well as the mulch and maintenance as listed on the grant application. Grant and budget as approved at prior SNC meeting.

The Project consists of the following:

- (1) Clear Triangle of debris.
- (2) Add native plantings in and around the two "Welcome to Shandon" signs. Add native plantings in the center of the Harden Street frontage. The native plantings will mingle around the signs and will not grow too high to obstruct views. Once established, they are drought tolerant.
- (3) The native plantings will be planted in accordance with Ms. Yenkey's recommendations. All plantings will be completed by December 31, 2022.
- (4) The Triangle will be irrigated through an appropriate irrigation schedule to ensure the native plantings establish and thrive.
- (5) A local landscaping company will provide ongoing monthly maintenance for the Triangle, along with the assistance of SNC Beautification Committee volunteers.

The estimated budget for the Project is: \$1,435 to \$1,585, broken down as follows:

- (1) Native plantings: \$775. See Attachments 2 & 3 (Summary and Pricing).
- (2) Soil Amendment: \$510. See Attached 4 (Estimate from KB Landscaping).
- (3) Delivery: \$150 to \$300. See Attachment 2 (rough estimate)

The SNC is providing funds to cover the cost of yearly maintenance by a local landscaping company. This cost is estimated to be \$2,125.00, broken down as follows: Initial cleanup \$250.00, bi-weekly maintenance \$1,875.00 (25 x \$75.00). See Attachment 4 (Estimate from KB Landscaping).

- Project Estimate:
 - Plants \$775
 - Soil Amendment (Mulch / Pine straw): \$510
 - Delivery: \$300
 - Bi-weekly Maintenance (25 x \$75/visit): \$1875.00
 - Total projected upfront investment: \$3,460.00
 - Less Columbia Green reimbursable grant \$775
 - SNC portion after reimbursement \$2,685.00
 - Motion to approve a budget of up to \$3,850 (\$3460, plus ~10%) for landscaping improvements to the Shandon Triangle Park. >>> APPROVED
- AT&T will be trimming their utility lines in Shandon this winter and spring. Citizens with specific questions or concerns should contact Forestry and Beautification at 803-545-3860 or AT&T at (803) 343-1694 to meet and discuss in advance of the work being completed.
- A small tree was knocked over at the Triangle Park in late December. City Forestry has removed it. SNC will be responsible for replacement if desired.

- Proposed amendments to the bylaws so far
 - Specially called meetings: Occasional need for special meetings between regular meetings, previously required 48h notice. Proposal to decrease to 24h notice. This is consistent with SC nonprofit act and FOIA.
 - Emergency procedures: If a national or local state of emergency or disaster that may put members at risk, the president and a majority of members can vote
 - Requirement that leaders of the committees created by the president keep some sort of record, this is a best practice and assists in transition of the role.
 - o Passing an annual budget for planned expenditures instead of voting individually per expense.
 - The outcome of elections will be posted in the minutes
