Recognition of Elected Officials, Special Guests, & Candidates for Office

- USC West Nile Virus Research Study
 - Dr. Nolan's research study, little brown mosquitos (not the black ones), 85% of people don't know they have it, 25% will have fevers, neck stiffness, headaches, rash
 - Effects children the most, commonly mis- and un-diagnosed
 - 6 people had it last year
 - Unfortunately there have been incidents of paralysis, death in our neighborhood
 - Mosquito traps set up in some yards in Shandon
 - QR code for survey
 - Will be doing fingersticks in the fall to test for West Nile antibodies
 - Clemson Extension- using companion plants and insect repellant plants
 - o Eucalyptus and peppermint oils,
 - Larvae are oval, floating around in water
 - Mosquito donuts for bird baths, less chemicals
- All Good Books Jared Johnson
 - An aside: The Oaks at St Anna- affordable housing, can sign up for news alerts from Columbia Housing, so you get the ping and are first in line for application, applicants need to ensure that they do not disqualify for public housing based on Federal guidelies
 - Co-Owner of All Good Books, downtown at 734 Harden St, locally owned and locally focused, opened in March, bookstore for new books, book clubs, beyond the transactional - space for wifi, coffee, wine, area of refuge, everyone is invited and included, building community, applying for B-Corps

 - Hoot in old Kracken
 - Lourie Center and Senior Resource Center (Richland Co Dept of Aging), everyone over age 55yo
 has access and senior programing, thanks Rep Heather Bauer
 - Send pothole information to the city, Excel spreadsheet (template from Forest Hills neighborhood), 75% of roads in the city are state roads
 - Downlights on Sims Park- LED upgrade with Dominion, they can also dampen down the light from the streetlights
 - Reg a maintenance list from Parks and Rec

Crime and Safety Report -

- MPO Boyd
 - Overall, crime rate is good
 - 1 vehicle theft in June, unlocked and keys were left in vehicle, Chatham Rd
 - Kias and Hyundais are #1 stolen car in US, esp. key starts
 - Reach out to manufacturer or dealership re: recalls
 - South Region headquarters can get you a lock for a steering wheel if you can prove you have that kind of car, M-F 8-5p Secretary Debbie can help, have to bring key fob registration etc. Vehicle does NOT need to be recalled to get a steering wheel lock.
 - o Helicopter on Fri and Sat nights, it's SLED doing training, surveillance
 - Increase in victims failing to press charges, police can not arrest unless victim wants to press charges
 - o Can call 2911 (non-emergent) vs 911 (same call center)

- Front porch roll call is restarting, reach out to MPO Boyd to schedule, or columbiapd.net > programs, Thursday at 1830pm, typically uniformed officers
- Warmer weather, can fill out form for property check, or call HQ 545-3500, South Region HQ 737-5882
- o 1 burglary suspect, 1 auto break-in suspect are in jail
- Surveillance video is helpful, upload video via text, can attach directly to the report, thumb drives and discs get turned into property
- Fireworks ordinance for July 4, Dec 31st—city ordinance is different from the county ordinance, county is until 10pm, city is Mon-Sun 7a-11pm every day, city is 7a-12:30am then 9a next AM (ord 14108, 2022-083), this is a civil penalty in city, not a criminal penalty. Criminal penalty in county.
