 Has passed but in committee.
 - County can shoot until 10p. 10p to 7am is a noise nuisance. Civil fines \$100, 750, 1000.
 Later than 10pm is Dec 31st, July 4th (1am to 7am quiet time).
 - Edisto discovery park for Columbia Water, can learn more about project for water and stormwater drainage

Zoning & Code Enforcement: Judy Anderson, chair

- The Zoning & Code Enforcement Committee met on Tuesday, August 22 at the Emily Douglas Park. The discussion centered around the three focus areas for the committee: Educate, Monitor and Investigate/Support.
- Educate: The committee may sponsor a public meeting on Rentals Short- and Long- Term. There would be information on the requirements and rules for rentals as well as how to handle/report incident/violations. The new Code Enforcement Officer in charge on Rentals has agreed to participate as have other city employees.
- Monitor: All committee members are now on the distribution lists for Board of Zoning Appeals and Design/Development Commission.
- Investigate/Support: Our Code Enforcement Officer continues to investigate issues/violations that we submit to him.
- Note: Zoning/Code Enforcement enquiries entered on our SNC home page will now automatically be forwarded to our committee.
