### So What Is The Market Doing Now?

As we enter this festive time of year I constantly find myself at gatherings being asked "so what is the real estate market doing now?" Although the market is not as frenetic as was seen earlier this year, buyer demand is still high, sales prices continue to rise and interest rates are still attractive.

**If you look at the MLS as a whole:** New Listings were up 17.6 percent to 1,278; Pending Sales increased 14.0 percent to 1,284, the eighth consecutive month of year-over-year gains; Inventory shrank 12.4 percent to 1,412 units; For the 12-month period spanning December 2020 through November 2021, Pending Sales in the CMLS region were up 10.8 percent overall. The price range with the largest gain in sales was the \$300,001 and Above range, where they increased 43.5 percent.

**If you just look at Shandon, Year-to-Date:** There are currently 5 listings active for sale; 11 Pending sales; A total of 106 sold homes since 1/1/21; Average sold price is 402,563

**So in a nutshell:** Is it still a good time to sell? YES! Buyer demand is still there and their is less competition for sellers. Is it a good time to buy? YES! Interest rates are still very attractive, which means buyers have more buying power than ever before.

### **Best Practices For Pet & Animal Issues**

**Safety Issues:** Shandon residents are encouraged to report incidents of aggressive animals or other safety-related complaints by calling 911 or the CPD non-emergency line at 803-252-2911. Please report concerns to the police before posting on social media.

**Report Abuse:** If you know of an animal in need, even if it is minor, call Columbia Animal Services at 803-776-7387.

**Lost & Found:** A new Lost Pets section has been added to the neighborhood website. The ability to submit missing pet posters and details about spotted animals is coming soon! For more information, visit <u>http://shandonneighborhood.org/lost-pets/</u>.

**Strays:** If you would like to report a stray animal in the City of Columbia, please call Animal Services at 803-776-7387. Should you come across a stray, here are a few tips:

• don't run; stand still, usually the dog will sniff you and then leave you alone

• don't touch a sick, injured, or scared animal as it may bite you out of fear or surprise

• avoid staring into a dog's eyes, it may think you are threatening them

Adoption Services: If you are thinking of adopting a pet, visit <u>animalservices</u>. <u>columbiasc.gov/adoption/</u> to learn about the process and things to consider. For information about available pets, visit <u>www.petfinder.com</u> which is updated daily.

**Surrendering An Owned Animal:** If for any reason you can no longer look after your pet, please review your options at <u>animalservices.columbiasc.gov/</u><u>surrender/</u>. Pet owners who wish to surrender a pet should call Columbia Animal Services at 803-776-7387.

**Licensure, Breeding, Leashing, Other Laws:** All pets in the City of Columbia must be licensed. Pet breeding is not allowed within City limits. All dogs must be on a leash; failure to leash may result in a \$200 fine.
