
FillTheRedTruck.org to make a monetary contribution or order food and supplies to be shipped directly to the shelter. This online donation option is available year-round.

ELECTED OFFICIALS CORNER

Dear Shandon Neighbors, My time thus far as your councilman has been an honor, and I have enjoyed getting to know you and more about our community's needs.

While our City has been challenged by modifications required for the unprecedented Covid-19 pandemic, we continue to overcome challenges and obstacles, while making improvements that have long been needed for our growing city. Basic services are the foundation of our quality of life, and I continue to strive to improve their seamless delivery, as well as repair, maintain, and improve our infrastructure. I am proud of the work that has been accomplished so far.

To keep our community safe and secure, I have advocated for the Columbia City Police Department to hire many more emergency services personnel, and peace patrol officers, to keep a constant presence. Captain P.J. Blendowski is assigned personally to Shandon as your liaison. In addition to public incident updates, he can answer security questions, schedule security checks and conduct informative front porch "roll calls" at your and your neighbors' requests. If you would like to host a front porch roll call, please contact me to arrange this for you.

I have made significant progress on the Shandon storm drainage improvements project involving our city partners. This project will stop the significant floods at several critical intersections in the Shandon neighborhood by upgrading two trunklines of storm drainage pipes. The latest status update from Dana R. Higgins, PE, LEED AP, our Director of Engineering with Columbia Water, states that the bulk of the design phase for the West trunkline portion of the project is complete. Easement acquisition is the currently underway, and is expected to take 9-12 months, with the construction start date falling 4-6 months after all easements have been obtained. The East trunkline of the project is now 60% designed and will follow the construction of the West trunkline. This project is being funded through the City's Stormwater Bond Program and total estimated project cost is \$21 Million. A more refined construction cost estimate will be developed and available as the design is finalized.

The past year many areas of our streets were repaired in a concerted effort by both our city and state. However, pothole repairs are ongoing, as the geographic placement and geological features of our city expedite the formation of new potholes. I am very grateful for everyone's reports of pothole locations, which have helped facilitate this work, especially the photos and address locations. Please continue to reach out to me to collaborate repair work. We must continue to be vigilant. Pot holes can be reported by calling (803)545-3790.

The effort to establish Quiet Zones in Columbia, including our 14 railway crossings from Gadsden to Beltline, is underway and moving forward, due to successful collaboration over the last three years directed by me with City Council and staff working alongside the Quiet Zone Committee, FRA, SCDOT, Norfolk Southern & CSX.

Rep. Seth Rose and I were able to get a very needed pedestrian crossing and stoplight installed on Devine Street by Backstreets Grill and Il Giorgione.

My aim is to ensure planned projects and those in process are finished, but I need your help to accomplish this. Please stay in touch, message me, and follow my social media accounts on both Facebook and Instagram:
