Letter from Shandon Neighborhood Council

Neighbors,

As of July first, Shandon resident and SNC officer, Harrison Greenlaw, begins a two year term as President of the Columbia Council of Neighborhoods (CCN). This Council, comprised of the 150 neighborhoods of the city of Columbia, encourages communication and assistance between neighborhoods, city leaders and city departments. Key CCN services include small grants and service awards (Neighborhood of the Year, Neighborhood Volunteer of the Year, and Best Neighborhood Program) are noted.

CCN co-sponsors (with Columbia Police and key city services) the city's National Night Out kickoff event before neighborhoods host their own NNO events. This year the city NNO kickoff will be held indoors at the Columbia Convention Center, Thursday, July 27, 5:30-7:30 pm. Food, department and neighborhood displays, and safety in the city with first responders are front and center. Shandon residents are invited to attend the city NNO kickoff and Shandon's NNO at Sims Park, Tuesday, August 1st, 6-8 pm featuring music, ice cream, hot dogs, and neighborhood meet and greet with City officials, Police, and Fire Departments. Shandon has invited Sherwood Forest Neighborhood residents to attend Shandon's NNO this year.

Many Columbia neighborhoods admire Shandon. Why? A plethora of Shandon residents step forward to serve on our 15 person Council, and help with beautification projects (such as last month's cleaning at Emily Douglas Park). Shandon residents assist with neighborhood events from the Easter Egg Hunt for the little ones to the NNO. Other neighborhoods are amazed Shandon mails quarterly, free newsletters designed by a volunteer editor. And, they are envious of our outstanding Turkey Trot fundraiser that affords the Shandon Neighborhood Council an ample treasury to help the neighborhood.

CRIME WATCH - THE CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY

The Citizens Police Academy is a ten-week educational program about law enforcement that highlights the Columbia Police Department, its functions, specialized units, and the criminal justice system. Participants will learn about Crime Scene Investigations, Gang and Narcotics Unit, 9-1-1 Dispatch Center, SWAT and much more! Do not worry, there are no tests or exams, but the Academy does end with a graduation ceremony, dinner and ride-along with one of Columbia's finest. CPD aims to have two Academy sessions per year with one in the spring and one in the fall. Academy sessions will run for 10 weeks on Tuesday evenings from 6 P.M. to 8 P.M. Iced tea, water and small snack items are provided. Attendees must be at least 18-years old by the first day of class. A background check will be performed on all applicants. It's FREE! ELECTED OFFICIAL'S CORNER

I'm excited to share some of the things we've been working on in our city. We know that Shandon residents are very passionate and involved citizens, so thank you for being agents of change in Columbia and for caring about our community.

We've been focused a lot on beautification in our city and how to improve our gateways. With 71% of our roads being controlled by the state, and a shortage of upkeep and maintenance money for local communities, we have taken a creative new approach to being a partner. The state is allowing city staff and contractors to perform landscaping, weeding, trimming, edging, and a variety of other measures along their roadways so we aren't left to live with their shortcomings. An added benefit to this is our ability to support local small businesses by offering contracts to get work done as well.

We're also focused on improving customer service in city departments. When I first took office in 2022, the city was behind by almost 6,000 work orders in the water department. That number is around 2,000 now, which means that we are catching up even with new work coming in every day. All of this is being done while our water department is facing a staffing shortage because our city staff has focused on streamlining services and improving response times. All of this does involve some community engagement though, so treat our city like an airport: if you see something, say something. Let us know where we can help or do better and we will work on fixing it!

One last thing I wanted to mention is our ongoing efforts to improve public safety. Across the nation, police and fire departments are having a hard time with recruitment and Columbia is no different. For our police, we are offering \$5,000 moving bonuses and a revamped pay plan that allows CPD officers to earn more money and to earn money without being boxed into jobs they don't want. For our fire department, we are working to raise their pay significantly, adjust our outdated system of offering leave, and find other benefits to improve recruitment. We also announced Operation Hope and Order on June 13th, which is focused on getting the homeless people off of our streets and finding housing solutions for them. We are giving people options for housing, helping them find treatment, and generally showing compassion by enforcing our city rules.

We are working every day for a better Columbia, but we can always use your help. We are open to new ideas and suggestions, so let us know what you think and how we're doing! We look forward to hearing from you and thank you again for caring so much about our great city.
